

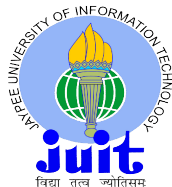


### 7.1.6. Beyond the campus environmental promotion activities

## **Visit to Wakna Village- Interaction and Identification of their Issues**

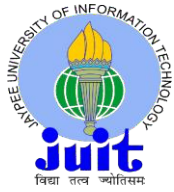

## Survey and Interaction with Bisa Villagers

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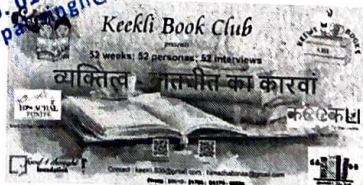
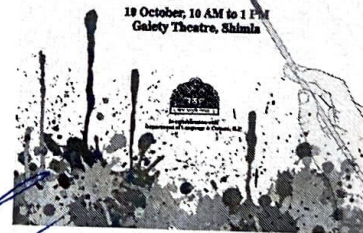


### Anti-Tobacco Campaign

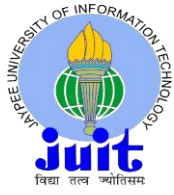
